Moonshot Museum is Pennsylvania's first dedicated space museum and the first in the world to offer a literal window into the real-time work of the contemporary space industry,

In Year 1 of Cosmic Careers, Moonshot will present a theatrical planetarium show and educational robot in schools to spark interest. Connections will be made to the burgeoning space industry in our Appalachian region. Year 2: Students visit Moonshot to participate in an immersive team-building adventure. Year 3: As a classroom unit, students create art and

science payloads to fly on high-altitude balloons, track their payloads' voyage, while engaging with Carnegie Mellon University robotics students. Moonshot aims to engage up to 93,000 students over the grant and 285,000 more through ongoing programs.
