NASA's Space Operations Mission Directorate, in coordination with the Exploration Systems Development Mission Directorate, is now accepting Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 nominations for the following Space Flight Awareness (SFA) Program awards: Flight Safety, Management, Silver Snoopy, Supplier, Trailblazer, and Team.

The SFA Program ensures that each employee involved in human space flight is aware of the importance of their role in promoting astronaut safety and mission success. You are encouraged to use these awards throughout the year to recognize deserving employees and teams to the maximum extent possible. The program also recommends that you recognize the diversity of our workforce when submitting your nominations.

Employees selected for SFA awards will be evaluated and must meet the specified criteria. The award criteria are available on the program's Webpage: <https://www.nasa.gov/space-flight-awareness/>. A completed nomination form (NASA Form 1738) with typewritten justification (one-page only) using appropriate criteria must accompany each nomination for all awards. Please ensure you select the appropriate award name (Flight Safety, Management, Silver Snoopy, Supplier, Trailblazer, and Team) for the individual or team you are nominating.

Please note in addition to this call, NASA will also sponsor two FY 2025 Honoree Award events. A separate call was issued for these awards, which may be viewed on the program website. Employees selected as honorees are afforded an opportunity to travel to a NASA Center or contractor facility, be recognized by senior management officials during an award ceremony, receive a facility tour, and may have the opportunity to view a launch or other special activity.

As NASA moves forward with advancing human space exploration and taking the necessary steps to maintain America's pre-eminence in human space flight for years to come, we also renew our commitment to our employees. It is imperative that we strive to maintain a world-class workforce that can successfully deliver quality products and services.
